3CE Supporting Largest Clean-Energy Infrastructure Project in U.S. History

Central Coast Community Energy (3CE) and Silicon Valley Clean Energy (SVCE) have each signed 15-year contracts with Pattern Energy Group to receive electricity from SunZia Wind, a new renewable energy project in New Mexico. Pattern says the facility, together with its new 550-mile transmission line enabling the delivery of power to California, will be the largest clean-energy infrastructure project in the nation's history. The project is expected to come online in 2026 and provide more than 3,500 megawatts (MW) of new generation, enough to power the needs of more than 3 million Americans.

3CE will receive 200 MW of the total output for our customers, enough to power 150,000 homes and meet 11% of our communities' electricity needs. The project is in one of the windiest areas of the country and will provide a continued source of clean electricity during peak demand in the late afternoon and early evening, when solar output decreases. SunZia's energy will also reduce the need for fossil fuels to meet peak demand during extreme summer heat conditions.

Robert Shaw, 3CE CEO, said, "This project will help to diversify and enhance the reliability of our renewable portfolio and will help accelerate the cleaning of California's grid and our collective transition away from fossil fuels." To date, 3CE and SVCE have signed 12 joint power purchase agreements, totaling 1,513 MW of clean energy and 316 MW of storage.



3CE Member Agencies Ramping Up Efforts to Electrify Their Fleets

The City of Capitola on Dec. 11 unveiled its first all-electric street sweeper at City Hall. The purchase of the new sweeper was aided by incentive awards of \$250,000 from Central Coast Community Energy (3CE)'s Electrify Your Fleet Program and \$60,000 from the Monterey Bay Unified Air Pollution Control District. Speaking at the event, 3CE CEO Robert Shaw praised the power of partnership with local government to meet the community's needs, calling Capitola "a city that invests in its future and demonstrates leadership for the region."

This all-electric, zero-emission street sweeper replaces a traditional diesel model that has been in operation for more than 10 years. Over its lifetime, the R3Air sweeper will save 90 metric tons of carbon emissions, the equivalent of not burning nearly 9,000 gallons of diesel, helping Capitola meet the goals set forth in its Climate Action Plan.

3CE also recently approved a \$72,000 rebate for the City of Santa Maria's six new electric transport vans. Since launching Electrify Your Fleet in 2022, 3CE has funded 32 projects and set aside more than \$1.7 million in funds for fleet electrification.

3CE Attends SLO Chamber's Annual State of the State Event

On Dec. 12, 3CE Manager of Customer Accounts and Services Jenna Espinosa and Senior Accounts Manager Judi Young attended the San Luis Obispo Chamber of Commerce State of the State. Moderator Christine Robertson, Executive Director of the San Luis Coastal Education Foundation and founder of the Institute for Advanced Technology & Public Policy at Cal Poly, led an informative discussion with District 17 Senator John Laird and David Lesher, veteran journalist and state policy expert. Topics ranged from the expected — affordable housing, the economy, homelessness — to the unexpected: the Cal Poly project to provide transcripts of all State Legislature public meetings. Offshore wind, Diablo Canyon Power Plant, and even the inner workings of our state government were also discussed.
