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3CE Releases Annual Impact Report Highlighting “Power for Good”

Central Coast Community Energy (3CE) is proud to announce the release of our [2024 Annual Impact Report](#), highlighting a year of powerful progress toward a clean-energy future for the Central Coast. The report showcases how 3CE customers and communities are achieving more with their energy — electrifying transportation, building affordable housing, lowering emissions, and helping California lead the way in renewable energy.

Thanks to the active participation of 3CE customers, the agency invested nearly \$15 million in community programs and rebates in fiscal year 2023-24. These investments helped build more than 200 new all-electric affordable housing units, supported the electrification of school and public agency fleets, and empowered thousands of residents and businesses to upgrade to cleaner, more efficient technologies.

"The rebates we received through [3CE's [Electric Bus](#)] program will allow us to transport kids to where they need to be, even from rural areas," said Kris Sihler, Transportation Manager for Santa Cruz City Schools. "We couldn't have done this without the help of 3CE funds."

By the numbers, since 2018, 3CE has:

- Distributed \$11 million in total rebates
- Funded over 7,000 electrification projects
- Supported the purchase of 2,843 electric vehicles and 2,085 chargers
- Provided \$4 million in rebates for income-qualified customers and disadvantaged communities
- Delivered rebates for 1,458 all-electric affordable housing units

Beyond rebates, 3CE continues to grow its clean energy portfolio. In 2024, the agency sourced 409 megawatts of renewable power — enough to serve more than 350,000 homes — and helped avoid over 445,000 metric tons of CO₂ emissions, equivalent to taking over 105,000 gas-powered cars off the road for a year.

3CE also made major strides in energy affordability. Through its innovative Prepay Power Purchase Agreement program, the agency is projected to save customers \$32.9 million over seven years by reducing power procurement costs by more than 11%.

- Participated in 160 community events
- Hosted 16 farmworker outreach events
- Expanded Spanish-language services and offered tailored forums for the community
- Launched the hourly pricing and battery rebate programs to give customers more control over their electricity use

The 2024 Annual Impact Report reflects the meaningful progress made possible by the shared commitment of 3CE and its customers. As 3CE continues to expand access to clean energy and invest in local communities, every customer plays a vital role in shaping a cleaner, healthier, and more resilient future.

3CE Opens New San Luis Obispo Office, Deepening Local Roots



Central Coast Community Energy (3CE) is excited to share the grand opening of our new office in downtown San Luis Obispo! Located at 1026 Palm Street, this new space strengthens our commitment to serving the Southern region of our service area and brings us even closer to the communities we serve.

To celebrate this milestone, we welcomed community members, local officials, and partners for an Open House and Ribbon Cutting Ceremony on March 19. Guests had the chance to tour the new office, connect with 3CE staff, and hear from distinguished local leaders including SLO Mayor Erica A. Stewart, SLO County Supervisor and 3CE Policy Board Vice Chair Dawn Ortiz-Legg, Santa Cruz Mayor and 3CE Policy Board Chair Fred Keeley, and 3CE CEO Robert M. Shaw.

Our new San Luis Obispo location replaces our previous local office and creates more space for community engagement, staff collaboration, and in-person customer support. This new office is one more way we're showing up for you — our community. Stop by and say hello!

3CE Rate Adjustment Takes Effect April 1

Since 2018, Central Coast Community Energy (3CE) has offered fair and responsible rates for clean energy while providing economic and environmental benefits across the Central Coast. When setting customers' rates, 3CE's goal is to fairly recoup the cost of serving you, our customers. As a local public agency, we have no shareholders, and customer rates never include profit.

As of April 1, 3CE's rates will be adjusted to an average of \$0.14646 per kilowatt hour for residential customers. This adjustment represents an increase of approximately \$1.60 per monthly bill compared to 3CE rates as of January 1, 2025.

On average across all rate categories, including Residential, Commercial, Agricultural, Business EVs, Standby Power, and Streetlights, customers will see an increase of 0.43 cents/kWh, or 3%. The adjustment is the result of increases in costs associated with market conditions, a lower demand forecast, and changes in state regulations.

With the new 3CE electric generation rates, all customers will see average savings of between 1% and 3% compared to PG&E or SCE electric generation rates. Rates for [residential](#), [commercial](#), and [agricultural](#) customers in PG&E's and SCE's service areas can be viewed on 3CE's website.

As part of 3CE's work to invest in local communities, we offer our customers rebates and financial resources to electrify their homes, businesses, and transportation. More than \$14.8 million in cost-saving [rebates and incentives](#) is available to help customers save money in their transition to clean energy and to accelerate our region's progress toward 100% clean and renewable energy.


